Jesus said, "I am the Light of the World." -- John 8: 12

Lent, the 40-day season of penance and preparation for Easter, reminds us of a few important things, namely:

- 1) Our lives are not our own: they're a gift from God
- 2) Our time on earth is brief
- 3) We need seasons like Lent to remind us what matters most

When I think of Lent, I think of its Latin meaning, 'to lengthen' (as in the 'lengthening of days' becoming brighter between now and Easter — Christ's resurrection being, if you will, the brightest day of the year!

We need seasons like Lent to inspire us to 'get back to basics', and the 'bedrock' of our lives—remembering the hope and promises that are ours in Christ Jesus, and the purposes to which God calls us.

I hope this Lent will be that kind of Holy Time for you. I hope you'll join us Sundays in Lent* for a time of silent prayer before Worship (8:50-9:10 am in sanctuary), Adult Study 9:15 am, and a new sermon series.

Bring a friend or neighbor! If we each invite one person to attend Worship with us, our congregation will double. Let's pray it will double not only in numbers, but in God's grace!

MARSHA'S NOTE*

"Trust in the Lord with all your heart, and lean not on your own understanding; in all your ways acknowledge Him, and He shall direct your paths." Proverbs 3: 5-6

As a musician, I am always interested in reading about other musicians and what influences the words and music they create. I have several books that tell about the history and story behind various hymns. I enjoy going into the extra bedroom in my house where I do my morning devotionals. It is quiet and has many books from which I get inspiration along with my Bibles and hymnals. Here I listen for that still, small voice of God.

My grandmother had seven brothers who had a small publishing house. They would print paperback hymnals for use at revivals, tent meetings, and even for small churches. They also gave music lessons. My grandmother was also an influencer in my life because she encouraged my learning to play the piano and sing. Many times when I pray I start off singing a hymn to pull my thoughts and feelings together as I worship God. Recently, I was reading about a composer who was also influenced by a family member.

A young man named Daniel B. Towner inherited his father's love for music. His father was a vocalist and professor of music. Young Daniel began his career as a worship leader in a Methodist Church in New York state. Soon, he was traveling with the famous preacher, D.L. Moody, and singing at worship services. Around 1885 Daniel heard a young man's testimony about giving his life over to God by learning to "trust and obey." Daniel sent the story to a friend of his, Rev. J.H. Sammis, a Presbyterian Minister. Sammis composed a poem using the words "trust and obey." He sent the poem to Daniel, who put the words to music. The hymn "Trust and Obey" was first published in 1887.

I have sung this hymn since I was a child, and it is one of the first hymns I learned to play. Many times the words come to my mind while I am driving, praying, or listening to music. I have found comfort from the words especially during the past year. I am reminded that God is by my side whatever is happening around me. I only need to stop and listen for the words of comfort God whispers in my head.

"When we walk with the Lord in the light of his Word, what a glory he sheds on our way. While we do His good will, He abides with us still, and with all who will trust and obey. Trust and obey, for there's no other way to be happy in Jesus, but to trust and obey."






